PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

want to personally welcome everyone to Scottsdale and what should be a great 2017 annual conference. This year we have added concurrent sessions for Friday morning, which will focus on transactional and compliance matters, and you will notice industry experts joining us in a variety of sessions. The Conference Committee and Board of Directors carefully reviewed input from the member survey that was done late last year and have incorporated into the program issue areas of interest to many of you.

In addition to using the survey information to better execute the conference, we have also added new compliance resources on our web page, and for the first time, held a compliance officers round-table this summer. As we all continue to adapt to the changing regulatory environment, NAMA's work to educate our members and represent the MA profession to regulators remains a key focus for the organization. 


